Inclusive Education has become the focus of research more and more as the number of students with special needs educated in mainstreaming classes is rising nearly all over the world. However, inclusive education not only focuses on 'special' learners but also includes all learners. Within this context, it is important to examine how students themselves feel about inclusive education. Do they have a positive attitude towards inclusive education? Do students feel socially included? Which level of wellbeing do they experience in school?

This conference aims at giving insights into students' perspectives on inclusive education. Researchers and practitioners need to listen to students' voices to explore the opportunities and challenges of inclusive education and to create a better future for all students.

In addition, the conference is combined with the inaugural lecture of Professor Susanne Schwab, who started to work for the University of Vienna in October 2018.
